#### **GROUND RULES**

- Please ensure you wear suitable clothing on field trips the weather in Scotland can change very quickly, even in the summer. This does not mean it will rain or be cold, but it might be – or it could be hot and sunny. You never know! Have appropriate layers with you.
- 2. Please wear suitable footwear that you can step into a disinfectant foot bath with and walk across potentially muddy fields.
- 3. If there is a disinfectant footbath, please always use it. Biosecurity is very important, especially when many people are moving between multiple farms in one day.
- 4. Please embark and disembark the buses promptly our schedule for the field trips means we do not have a lot of time to spare.
- 5. At mealtimes, please enjoy the food and break but remember the schedule and please be ready to go on time.
- 6. At some of our sites, the toilet facilities will be limited. Please be patient and remember to be ready to be back on the bus in time to allow the tour to proceed on schedule.
- During the site visits (especially to farms) please stay with your designated group. This: 1) helps keep the tour to schedule; 2) helps you hear the translation; and 3) helps keep you safe from vehicles and livestock.
- 8. Please do not chat whilst the translation is underway, as doing so will impact on the understanding and enjoyment of others.
- 9. If there is a problem on the day, each group will have a leader. Please ask them to assist you.
- 10. Whilst there will be several food breaks during the day, these will be long days. Please feel free to bring snacks and drinks with you, and ensure you leave the buses tidy afterwards by taking your rubbish with you.
